

5th^{ANNUAL} Western States Golfers Tournament

Friday, Saturday & Sunday, Sept 4,5,6, 2015

This 5th annual 3-day tournament is being held at the Desert Willow Golf Resort in Palm Desert. This is a Team and Individual competition. There is also an optional Scramble tournament on Thursday, 9/3. The cost is \$240 for the 3-day tournament and \$70 for the optional scramble. Signups due by July 1.

Awards & Probable Payouts:

Team (Div A & B): 1st/2nd/3rd (\$280/\$200/\$160) note: Team Score is 3 best net scores each day
**in the event a team only has 3 players, the average net score each day will be used as their 4th

Individual (Flts 1,2,3[men],4[women]): 1st/2nd/3rd (\$100/\$75/\$50), 4th thru TBD (\$30)

Low Gross: 1st (\$100)

Closest-to-Pin : dozen golf balls for all par 3's

Longest Putt: 2 sleeves of balls (holes #9 & #18 each day)

** (optional, \$15 buy in) Skins: gross skins by flight (payout is the pot/#of skins)

** if you didn't pay ahead of time and want to get in, let Jim Hill or myself know on day one
(optional) Scrambles: 1st/2nd (\$200/\$100)

There is no formal get together on Thursday evening; however, you can join those playing in the Scramble following their round (approximately 1:00PM) at the restaurant/bar at Desert Willow. The Tournament awards ceremony will immediately follow the round on Sunday at the Desert Willow Resort restaurant (an area will be reserved for our group). Golf clubs can be stored at the course each day (i.e. left on the carts).
