And the USGA Handicap System

Where we differ from the USGA system

I. We don't accept scores outside SRPGA tournaments. [5.1] A basic premise of the USGA Handicap System is that a player will post every acceptable round for peer review.

II. We use tournament scores from longer than a year ago (up to 14? years ago!) [10-3.c.i.] The number of eligible tournament scores will be counted on a revolving twelve-month basis. [10-3.c.iv.] At each handicap revision, each T-Score in the "Best T-Score File" is checked to see if the score is older than one year and no longer part of the player's current twenty score history. If so, the score is deleted from the file.

Our Options

- 1. Continue as is, but discontinue claiming that we follow the USGA Handicap System. We may even want to post a disclaimer with our handicaps like Yahoo does: "The Yahoo! Sports Golf HandicapTracker is not endorsed by the USGA and the results derived from Yahoo! Sports Golf HandicapTracker cannot be used for any event requiring a USGA index." http://golf.sports.yahoo.com/tracker
- 2. Modify our software-based in-house system. For example, use two years of SRPGA tournament scores instead of just one year (still violates I and II), and discontinue claiming that we follow the USGA Handicap System.
- 3. Use a Web-based handicap service.

Advantage of a Web-based Handicap Service

- 1. Complies with I and II -- it's fairer.
- 2. Gives our members a true USGA handicap.
- 3. Potentially generates nice reports and statistics.
- 4. [I wonder . . .? Could we allow non-members to be part of the system, for a fee, without allowing them to play in our tournaments? If so, we could generate money for the SRPGA. Nonmembers would have to post their own scores. Would this be a mess or would it help pay for the system?]
