

The handicap system does not truly reflect the players ability. When a golfer plays 4 or 5 strokes above or below his handicap for 4 or 5 months and his handicap stays the same or drops only 1 stroke is not fair in my estimation.







I've played with guys that take 3 practice swings per stroke and they're no better than I am. Anyway I don't think anyone likes to wait very long in between shots. Maybe some kind of incentive--- I'll buy them a pitcher of their favorite beverage- for the very first group- the ones who have the course open in front of them- if they can finish in 4- 4-1/2 hours. And with that maybe the rest of us will follow suit. Anyway it is a problem- we just think we're a little better than we are and hence the extended 'pre shot' routine.
- 36. Slow play is the most common complaint. This is brought about by members with little to no course time and their only experience with golf is through the SRPGA. There is not much that can be done when using a shotgun start but when tee times are used these groups should tee off last so as to not hinder play. This might give them some incentive to improve thier level and speed of play as well as not impacting the SRPGA with regards to courses allowing us to use their facilities to host our tournaments.
- 37. Get some new blood into the Board and find new courses that would be more fun and ensure shorter times to play. Don't need to pay anyone for flight places just skill prizes and bragging rights should be enough. Spend the money and effort on making the foursomes a lottery rather than always have the same people play on the same foursomes and get the best Tee times if not a shot gun.
